

Addi Baby Jacket



You will need:

- Addi Kingsize (or equivalent)
- 100g DK weight baby yarn
- Waste yarn
- Loom pick
- Stitch markers
- Darning needle
- 5mm crochet hook

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Back:



Cast on 33 needles with waste yarn

Knit a few rows before changing to main yarn

Knit 27 rows

Row 28: Knit, cast off the last 3 stitches.

Row 29 = Row 28 (27 stitches remain)

30-47: Knit 18 rows

Cast off with waste yarn.

Fronts:



Cast on 19 needles with waste yarn

Knit a few rows before changing to main yarn

Knit 27 rows

Row 28: Knit, cast off final 3 stitches

29-42: Knit 14 rows

43: Knit 6 needles and pick up 13 stitches onto waste yarn

Knit 3 more rows on the remaining 6 needles.

Cast off with waste yarn.

For the other front side: Start from the other end of the machine so you produce the mirror image.

Arms:



Cast on 28 needles with waste yarn

Knit a few rows before changing to main yarn

Knit 8 rows

Row 9: Knit first 2 stitches together, knit to end

Row 10 = row 9

Row 11-26: Knit 16 rows

Row 27 = Row 9

Row 28 = Row 9


Rows 29-35: Knit 8 rows

Cast off with waste yarn (You could leave a long tail of main yarn here for finishing the cuff)

Sewing together:

Seam the shoulders using the 6 stitches from each of the fronts, join them to 6 stitches from each end of the back stitches.

Sew arms in place. Start with the three stitches on waste yarn at one end, across the top of the sleeve, ending with 3 stitches on the other side.



Finally: Sew up the sides of the jacket and along the bottom of the sleeve

Finishing:

Cuffs:

Use the long tail to single crochet around the cuff.

Edging:

Working in single crochet all the way around the jacket:

Using single crochet and either the same or a contrast yarn:

Start the first stitch at the bottom.

Join in yarn, ch1, SC in same space

Single crochet along all the bottom edge stitches.

Be careful not to miss any stitches where the front and back are joined

In the last stitch: SC, ch1, SC.

Turn and SC all the loops up the first side.

(If you want buttonholes: decide where these should be and then chain stitch until your buttonhole is big enough for the button chosen, skip the next loop and continue to SC up the side.)

SC until you reach the stitches held on the waste yarn. In the first stitch: SC, ch1, SC.

SC along the top.

When you reach the last stitch on the waste yarn: Put the needle through this stitch AND the first loop of the shoulder: SCTog.

2 SC into the next 2 loops

SC the last loop and the first stitch of the neck (on the waste yarn) together

SC across the neck until 1 stitch remains. SC this stitch and the first loop of the other shoulder together.

2 SC in the next 2 loops

SC the last loop and the first stitch on the waste yarn together.

SC across until you reach the last stitch. In the last stitch: SC, ch1, SC.

SC down the side until you reach the first SC you placed. SC, ch1 into the same space and slip stitch to join.

Block or press to finish.

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
